

HIGH SCHOOL ONLINE ENTRY INSTRUCTIONS

All entries must be submitted via our online contest system. Below are the directions for submitting your entries. We strongly recommend that you start making your entries early. You do not have to submit all entries at one time. You are able to continue to add more entries up until the deadline date.

Deadline for all entries is February 7, 2024.

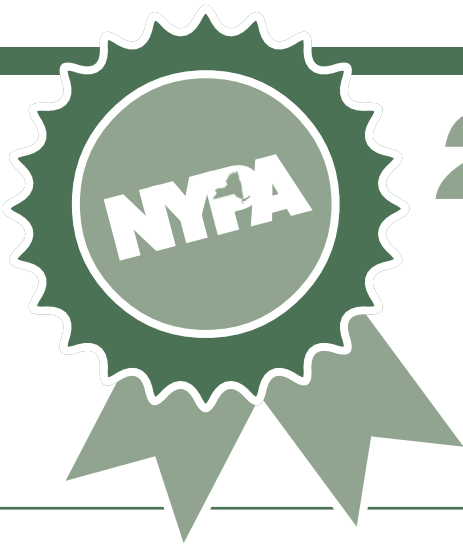
ONLINE ENTRY INSTRUCTIONS

1. Go to: <https://contest.nynewspapers.com>
2. Download the BNC Contest Rules and Entry Forms from the High School Newspaper Box.
3. Click on “Enter High School Newspaper”.
4. Create User Account (you will receive an email with a link that you must click on in order to activate your account).
5. Log into your account.
6. Select your “Newspaper” from the drop-down list. **If your Newspaper does not appear in the list, do not type it in. Please contact: jill@nynewspapers.com**
7. Select the “Category” that you are submitting from the drop-down list.
8. In the “Article/Photo Description” box, please enter the headline of the article or a description of the photo so that we know what the correct entry is. For online categories, please enter the URL of the page.
9. In the “Author” box, please enter the writer or photographer’s name.
10. Click on the “Browse” button to upload your pdfs. If the category requires hard copies to be sent to the NYPA office, you can skip this step.
11. Select the file(s) that correspond with your entry. **Please submit only ONE entry at a time (you may select multiple files for that one entry).** Please keep the file size to 15MB or less to aid judges in accessing your entry.
12. Once uploaded, you can view what you just uploaded. If it is not correct, you can click on the “Delete” button to remove that entry.
13. Enter your name in the appropriate box.
14. Click on the “Submit” button. Please allow time for the file to upload. It can take a few minutes for a large file.
15. Your entry will appear in your “cart” at the bottom of the page. **If you do not see your entry below, it did not upload properly and will need to be added again.**
16. To submit your next entry, go back up to the “Category” drop-down list again.
17. After all entries have been submitted, please review the “cart”.
18. You may still add more entries at a later time as you will be able to view what has previously been entered into your shopping chart. If you need assistance, please contact Jill Van Dusen.
19. Once the contest closes on February 7th, you will be sent an invoice for your entries with a link to pay via Stripe.

2023 High School Newspaper Contest

SPONSORED BY THE NEW YORK PRESS ASSOCIATION

Compete against New York State high schools in the New York Press Association's annual High School Newspaper Contest. Find out if your school's newspaper is among the best in New York State!

Contest year extends from January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023. Deadline for submission of entries is February 7, 2024. Entries MUST be uploaded on or before that date. If they are not, they will be disqualified.

CATEGORIES:

78. General Excellence — Overall quality of newspaper, including writing, design, photography, and advertising. Submit one complete copy of any three issues from the contest year. Submit those three issues in pdf format, as they count as one entry. (Upload three separate files: Label them as follows; 78_1.pdf; 78_2.pdf; and 78_3.pdf)

79. News Story — Submit tearsheet as pdf with entry clearly marked. Entry will be judged on difficulty in obtaining story, use of sources, completeness of coverage, impact of lede and quality of writing.

80. Feature Story — Story content must be directly related to readership, but may be any type of feature, (ie. sports, lifestyle, etc.) and may include photos. Judges will look at quality of writing first, but will weigh use of photos, art, and page design. Submit clearly marked tearsheet as pdf and name of writer.

81. Column — Any regularly published column relating to readership. Submit tearsheets of two columns written by the same writer, and the name of writer. Submit those two columns as one pdf, as they count as one entry.

82. Design — Overall design including page layout, color and organization. Submit one complete copy of any two issues published during the contest year. Submit those two issues in pdf format, as they count as one entry. (Upload two separate files: Label them as follows; 82_1.pdf; and 82_2.pdf)

83. Photography — Submit tearsheet as pdf of single photo for feature, sports or news coverage. Photos will be judged on composition, focus, and detail. Clearly acknowledge photographer's name.

84. Best Sports Story — Submit one marked tearsheet as pdf of any local sports story. Entry will be judged on originality, enterprise, thoroughness and quality of writing.

85. Best Web Site — Judged on the complete Web site (including blogs, multi-media, audience engagement, design, ease of navigation, quality of content, email alerts, as well as use of the Web Site to drive people to the print product, and vice versa. Provide newspaper Web address (url link) and any login and password if required.

RULES:

Writers and photographers must have been full-time students at the time of publication. An entry is one sample from one writer or photographer. All entries must be submitted in pdf format, with entry portions marked clearly each tearsheet. Entries that are not properly identified will be disqualified. Use only one entry form.

Entries that are not properly identified will be disqualified. Use only one entry form for all entries from your school.

All entries become property of the New York Press Association.

Entries will be judged by the following point system:

- 1st place = 20 points,
- 2nd place = 10 points,
- 3rd place = 5 points

First, second and third place awards will be made in each category and division. Judges' decisions are final.

Contest entry forms must be accompanied by a fee of \$10.00 per entry. Make checks payable to NYPA or fill out credit card information. Entry fees are non-refundable.

The overall best high school newspaper will win a plaque and be announced during New York Press Association's spring conference held April 26th and 27th, 2024.

Check to make sure entries are submitted in the proper category — eg., a column is NOT a feature or an editorial, etc.
